Call to Order

Chairman Barto called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.

Roll Call of Members by the Clerk

All members of the Board of Supervisors answered roll call.

Pledge of Allegiance and Moment of Silence

Presentation

John Cleere from the Sheriff's Office, and Lynda Stanistreet and Connie Foster from CPS were commended for their efforts in their investigation of a multi-county child sex ring case operating in Wayne County.

Deputy John Nesbit and Deputy Jamie Conkey, were commended for developing a case involving a large scale drug dealer from Rome New York. This dealer was one of the major distributors of marihuana coming into Seneca County. Through their efforts and investigation, working in conjunction with the Rome Police Department, the drug dealer was charged and arrested.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

The minutes for the September 25, 2007 board meeting were approved.

At this time, the Board of Supervisors recognized by resolution the Waterloo Girl Scout Troop 350 for their outstanding accomplishment in earning the Silver Award, the second highest award that girl scouts can earn. The troop spent 1,035 hours promoting their project, "Waterloo on Watch", by encouraging people to form watch groups, visiting homes, answering questions and giving residents printed information.

**SUPERVISORS RECOGNIZE AND CONGRATULATE WATERLOO GIRL SCOUT TROOP 350**  
RESOLUTION NO. 264-07, moved by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Mooney and unanimously adopted by 750 ayes.

WHEREAS, Girl Scout Troop 350 began "Waterloo on Watch" in April 2007 as their community project for girl scouts for 2007; and

WHEREAS, the nine member troop spent a total of 1,035 hours promoting the Waterloo on Watch Program, mounting a door to door campaign encouraging people to form watch groups, visiting homes, answering questions and giving residents printed information; and

WHEREAS, the girl scouts made presentations at LaFayette Elementary School, Main Street Elementary School and Waterloo Middle School, sending the message, making neighborhoods safer by keeping an eye out for their neighbors and for suspicious people and activity; and

WHEREAS, on October 1, 2007 Girl School Troop 350 was presented with the Silver Award, the second-highest award a girl scout can earn for the Waterloo on Watch community project; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Seneca County Board of Supervisors does hereby recognize and congratulate the following members of Girl Scout Troop 350 for their outstanding accomplishment in earning the Silver Award, the second highest award that girl scouts can earn: Jill Boudreau, Leader; Katie Hadyk, Steph Spina, Hailie King, Emily Boudreau, Haleigh Wright, Molly Lahr, Melissa Kaiser, Leah O'Connor and Jacque Boudreau.

#### Reports of Standing Committees

Mental Health Committee, Mrs. Amidon, Chairperson, announced that the Community Services Board recognized Dr. Kang Yu, the psychiatrist at Seneca County Community Services, for his years of service and dedication.

Public Works Committee, Mr. Davidson, Chairman, reported that the agreement to lease additional space for Wayne-Finger Lakes BOCES was recommended by the committee for a board resolution.

Public Safety Committee, Mr. Shipley, Chairman, reported that the reviewed the current appointments for the Traffic Safety Board. Several of the terms were expired and the members were serving as holdovers. The committee recommended that the Traffic Safety Board update the appointments according to Vehicle and Traffic Law Sec. 1673.

Human Services Committee, Mr. Mooney, Chairman, reported that the committee recommended a board resolution to approve the Office for the Aging Four Year Plan.

Indian Affairs Committee, Dr. Dresser, Chairman, reported that Richard Rifkin, Special Counsel to the Governor received the letters sent by Chairman Barto to the governor, requesting the enforcement of sales tax collection on gasoline and cigarette sales made to non-Indian consumers and on the negotiations by the state for a casino in the Catskills not to take place at the objection of Seneca and Cayuga counties. Wayne County and Fulton County legislative bodies also sent letter to the governor. Dr. Dresser also reported that he was working to set up a conference call with Upstate Citizen's for Equality and Senator Schumer's Washington office. He expected the call would be made within two weeks. A complete copy of Dr. Dresser's report was filed with the Office of the Clerk of the Board.

Public Health Committee, Mr. Lafler, Chairman, reported that the committee recommended a board resolution authorizing the Chairman Barto to sign grants for Early Intervention Administration for

\$30,562; Children with Special Health Care Needs for \$16,884; and Adolescent Tobacco Use Prevention Act (ATUPA) for \$28,103.

Planning, Development, Agriculture & Tourism Committee, Mr. Kaiser, Chairman, reported that the committee recommended a board resolution authorizing Chairman Barto to sign documents to accept the Governor's Office Small Cities for \$100,000 and a board resolution authorizing a public hearing for the grant on November 27. Mr. Kaiser also reported that the committee continued to discuss the TPA designation. The committee received an agreement for consulting services by Seneca County for the Chamber of Commerce to review. The issue was laid on the table for the committee meeting on November 13.

Government Operations Committee, Mr. Smith, Chairman, reported that the committee recommended a board resolution opposing Governor Spitzer's plan to give driver licenses to illegal aliens. Finance, Assessment & Insurance Committee, Mr. Anglim, Chairman, reported that the committee recommended a board resolution in favor of a three percent salary increase for management employees for the 2008 budget.

#### Chairman's Remarks

The topic of Chairman Barto's remarks was, "Driver's Licenses for Illegal Aliens Are Just Wrong"

Earlier tonight (October 23), the county's Government Operations Committee, chaired by Dale Smith, also considered a resolution criticizing this plan. That committee, acting on a suggestion from Waterloo County Supervisor Robert Shipley, voted to condemn the plan. It will now go to the full Board of Supervisors.

I expect that, like the legislatures of nearly one dozen other New York counties, this board of supervisors will vote to oppose the plan. I know that I will be voting to condemn the Governor's program and urge my fellow supervisors to do likewise.

Last month, I spoke to you on the Anniversary of September 11 and promised you that we in Seneca County would not forget. Unfortunately, it appears that Governor Spitzer has, in fact, forgotten the lessons of that terrible day. The September 11<sup>th</sup> hijackers all used drivers' licenses to purchase their airline tickets rent cars and reserve hotel rooms. As a result, the state and nation cracked down on the issuance of drivers' licenses without proper I.D. Now, our governor wants to reverse course and return us to a September 10 mentality.

Make no mistake: contrary to what the Governor and some of his supporters have tried to tell us, this is not about preventing immigrants from legally entering the United States. As former President Franklin Roosevelt observed, "remember always that all of us...are descended from immigrants." This is about our safety and our security. This is about not

rewarding those who have entered our country illegally. This is about equal treatment under the law.

### **RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OPPOSING GOVERNOR SPITZER'S PLAN TO GIVE DRIVERS' LICENSES TO ILLEGAL ALIENS**

RESOLUTION NO. 265-07, moved by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Shipley and adopted by 699 ayes (Smith, Shipley, Reynolds, Barto, Davidson, Kaiser, Same, Lafler, Anglim, Amidon, Teichner, Mooney, Robinson) and 51 nays (Dresser).

WHEREAS, the Federation for American Immigration Reform estimates that New York pays out some \$4.5 billion more on behalf of illegals than it collects from the tax revenue they generate; and

WHEREAS, in both attacks on the World Trade Center, in 1993 and on September 11, terrorists relied on the use of driver's licenses, in some cases obtained with the assistance of illegal aliens; and

WHEREAS, the 9/11 hijackers accumulated licenses from across the country, which were used to attend flight schools, rent safe houses and board planes without showing passports; and

WHEREAS, following the 9/11 terrorist attacks, New York began checking license applicants' Social Security numbers against the federal database, resulting in, more than 100,000 stolen numbers being identified; and

WHEREAS, Congress has ordered every state to adopt proof-of-citizenship requirements by 2009; and

WHEREAS, giving drivers licenses to illegal aliens may be a violation of the "federal Real ID Act of 2005" which specifically requires documentation of legal status and a valid Social Security number for state-issued drivers licenses, as well as the provisions of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law; and

WHEREAS, after 9/11, upholding a legal process that can help weed out terrorists is vital to the safety and security of New Yorkers everywhere; and

WHEREAS, illegal aliens should not receive the same benefits as legal immigrants to shores; and

WHEREAS, despite these legitimate security interests, Governor Eliot Spitzer recently stated that all illegal aliens in our State will now be eligible to receive a New York State driver's license; and

WHEREAS, Seneca County, through its Clerk's office, is responsible for issuing New York State drivers' licenses; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Seneca County Board of Supervisors is strongly opposed to this decision by Governor Spitzer, in that granting driver's licenses to illegal aliens may raise serious dangers to homeland security and may be in violate of state and federal law; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is directed to transmit a copy of this resolution to the Governor's office, Senator Michael Nozzolio, Assemblyman Brian Kolb, Senate Leader Joseph Bruno, Assembly Leader Sheldon Silver and the New York State Association of Counties.

**CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO SIGN  
AN INTERMUNICIPAL AGREEMENT WITH YATES COUNTY ON BEHALF OF THE S2AY  
RURAL HEALTH NETWORK**

RESOLUTION NO. 266-07, moved by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Lafler and unanimously adopted by 750 ayes.

WHEREAS, the members of the Finger Lakes Public Health Alliance, a regional consortium of 9 counties (Seneca, Steuben, Schuyler, Ontario, Wayne, Yates, Chemung, Livingston and Monroe) will be contracting with the S2AY Rural Health Network for planning on a regional basis and coordination of drills and exercises; and

WHEREAS, the cost of this agreement will be \$6,000; and

WHEREAS, this funding will be paid from the 2007-2008 Bio-Terrorism Grant with no county cost; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized and directed to sign this inter-municipal agreement.

**CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO SIGN A  
CONTRACT WITH YATES COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE S2AY  
RURAL HEALTH NETWORK**

RESOLUTION NO. 267-07, moved by Mr. Lafler, seconded by Mr. Mooney and unanimously adopted by 750 ayes.

WHEREAS, the S2AY Rural Health Network is comprised of the Public Health Departments in seven contiguous counties (Seneca, Schuyler, Steuben, Allegany, Yates, Wayne, and Ontario); and

WHEREAS, the Network has been in existence since 1997 with Seneca County joining in 2003; and

WHEREAS, the networks mission is "to integrate, promote, and expand appropriate components of the public health delivery system to improve health outcomes for all residents of the Network region. The goal is to ensure coordinated services across a seven county area and to streamline administrative processes, planning and funding activities"; and

WHEREAS, the cost for this membership is \$15,000 for the year; and

WHEREAS, the cost for this membership is included in the departmental 2008 budget 10-115-5-4010-4280; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized and directed to sign a contract with Yates County Public Health.

**CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO SIGN  
CONTRACTS FOR THE EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAM**

RESOLUTION NO. 268-07, moved by Mr. Lafler, seconded by Mrs. Amidon and unanimously adopted by 750 ayes.

WHEREAS, Donna Bruno, 72 Metcalf Drive, Auburn (Special Instruction) and Christine Toner, 127 Maxwell Avenue, Geneva (Speech Therapy) have been providing services for the Early Intervention Program; and

WHEREAS, these contracts need to be renewed for the continuation of these services; and

WHEREAS, the funding for these services is in the Public Health Department budget 4145.470; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized and directed to sign the contracts with Donna Bruno and Christine Toner.

**2008 RESOURCE ALLOCATION PLAN FOR STATE AID FUNDING FOR YOUTH  
PROGRAMS**

RESOLUTION NO. 269-07, moved by Mr. Mooney, seconded by Mrs. Teichner and unanimously adopted by 750 ayes.

WHEREAS, the Resource Allocation Plan is an annual plan that is submitted to the New York State Office of Children and Family Services to receive state aid funding for youth programs; and

WHEREAS, this plan needs to be submitted by November 16, 2007; and

WHEREAS, the Seneca County Youth Board approved the Allocations for State Aid at the September 24, 2007 meeting; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 state aid for Seneca County youth programs is \$126,348.00; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 Resource Allocation Plan has been reviewed by the Oversight Committee for Human Services and Finance Committee and recommended for full Board approval; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, the Seneca County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the 2008 Resource Allocation Plan for State Aid Funding for Youth Programs and authorizes and directs the Chairman of the Board to sign the Resource Allocation Plan for 2008.

**SUPERVISORS ACCEPT \$29,500 NEW YORK STATE OFFICE OF HOMELAND SECURITY  
GRANT FOR MOBILE RADIO REPEATER EQUIPMENT**

RESOLUTION NO. 270-07, moved by Mr. Shipley, seconded by Mr. Mooney and unanimously adopted by 750 ayes.

WHEREAS, the New York State Office of Homeland Security has awarded the Seneca County Sheriff's Department a \$29,500 grant through the 2006 Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program (LETPP) for the purpose of installing fifteen mobile radio repeaters into Seneca County Sheriff's Department vehicles in order to improve connectivity with the County's emergency response radio network; and

WHEREAS, this program will provide 100% of the funds necessary to purchase fifteen sets of mobile radio repeater equipment to be installed in Sheriff's Department and other emergency response vehicles, and which allow the vehicle's radio to act as a bridge between the responder's personal radio and emergency response radio network; and

WHEREAS, \$14,122.00 has already been appropriated to this program in the 2007 Seneca County Budget, requiring a transfer of \$15,378.00 from the contingency fund budget line; and

WHEREAS, this request was reviewed and approved by the Public Safety Committee on October 9, 2007; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized and directed to sign any and all necessary contract documents with the New York State Office of Homeland Security; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Seneca County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2007 Seneca County Budget to transfer \$15,378.00 from 1990.470 Contingency fund to 3113.2800, the Sheriff-Road Patrol Homeland Security Grant line.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE IT DEPARTMENT TO PURCHASE A WEB HOSTING DEVICE AND TREASURER AUTHORIZED APPROPRIATE FUNDS FROM THE IT RESERVE FOR SAID PURCHASE**

RESOLUTION NO. 271-07, moved by Mr. Reynolds, seconded by Mr. Davidson and unanimously adopted by 750 ayes.

WHEREAS, in August 2006 the IT Department installed a Barracuda web filter device, on a trial basis; and

WHEREAS, the Barracuda device is CIPA (Children's Internet Protection Act) compliant which is required by schools and public organizations for web filtering to help insure safe Internet content for children and public accessible places; and

WHEREAS, the total cost for the device including 3 years of support is \$6,650; and

WHEREAS, the funds for this purchase will be taken from the IT reserve; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the IT Department is authorized to purchase the internet web filtering device; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Seneca County Treasurer is hereby authorized to appropriate the sum of \$6,650 from the IT Reserve to account 1680.230 – IT Computer equipment for said purchase.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO SIGN A CONTRACT WITH RELCOMM, INC. TO PROVIDE REMEDIAL AND PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE FOR SENECA COUNTY'S TELEPHONE SYSTEM**

RESOLUTION NO. 272-07, moved by Mr. Reynolds, seconded by Dr. Dresser and unanimously adopted by 750 ayes.

WHEREAS, the one year warranty for Seneca County's telephone dystem expired September 30th, 2007; and

WHEREAS, funds were budgeted for 2007 for the purpose of providing continued maintenance; and

WHEREAS, after meeting with vendors the IT Department decided to work with RelComm, Inc., since they were directly involved with the telephone system installation; and

WHEREAS, RelComm, Inc. is under state contract (NYS OGS – 77009 T960252); and

WHEREAS, RelComm, Inc. provided the lowest price of \$951.08 per month; now, therefore be it  
RESOLVED, that the Chairman, Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized and directed to sign  
into agreement with RelComm, Inc. to provide remedial and preventative maintenance for Seneca County's  
telephone system to be paid from account 1680.4220.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AMENDMENT TO LEASE FOR ADDITIONAL SPACE FOR  
WAYNE-FINGER LAKES BOCES**

RESOLUTION NO. 273-07, moved by Mr. Davidson, seconded by Mrs. Teichner and unanimously  
adopted by 750 ayes.

WHEREAS, Wayne-Finger Lakes BOCES currently has a lease agreement with the County for the  
use of 2,112 square feet on the third floor of the County Office Building located at 1 DiPronio Drive,  
Waterloo, New York; and

WHEREAS, the annual rent was set by the June 21, 2004 lease renewal agreement at \$9.50 square  
feet for a total rental cost of \$20,064.00 per year, with the current lease expiring on July 31, 2009; and

WHEREAS, Wayne-Finger Lakes BOCES approached the County to request an addition of 768  
square feet to the current lease, which is currently the meeting room used primarily by Wayne-Finger  
Lakes BOCES; and

WHEREAS, no renovations are required for the occupancy of this space; and

WHEREAS, with the additional 768 square feet the current lease would be amended and increased  
by \$7,296 annually; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Seneca County Board of Supervisors does hereby authorize an addendum to  
the current lease agreement with Wayne-Finger Lakes BOCES for an additional 768 square feet at \$9.50  
per square feet for a total of \$7,296 per year.

**AMENDMENT TO RESOLUTION NO. 230-07 TO INCREASE MATCHING FUNDS**

RESOLUTION NO. 274-07, moved by Mr. Kaiser, seconded by Mr. Same and unanimously adopted by  
750 ayes.

WHEREAS, the Seneca County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 230-07 on August 28, 2007, which committed up to \$90,000 from the Seneca County Room Tax in 2007-08 to provide the county's share of the Matching Funds Program; and

WHEREAS, the state awarded Seneca County a matching grant of \$90,806; and

WHEREAS, this resolution has been reviewed and approved by the Planning, Development, Agriculture & Tourism Committee on October 23, 2007; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that Seneca County will commit up to \$90,806 from the Seneca County room tax in 2007-08 to provide the county's share of the Matching Funds Program.

**SUPERVISORS SUPPORT RED RIBBON WEEK OCTOBER 23 – 31, 2007**

RESOLUTION NO. 275-07, moved by Mr. Mooney, seconded by Mrs. Amidon and unanimously adopted by 750 ayes.

WHEREAS, alcohol and other drug abuse in the nation has reached epidemic stages; and

WHEREAS, local leaders are becoming increasingly concerned about the rise in use of alcohol and other drugs in Seneca County; and

WHEREAS, the Seneca County community understands that the problems of alcohol and other drug abuse must be attacked through a variety of protection programs, including: public awareness, prevention education, and family based programming, treatment, and law enforcement actions; and

WHEREAS, the National Family Partnership is sponsoring the National Red Ribbon Campaign which offers citizens the opportunity to demonstrate their commitment to drug free lifestyles; and

WHEREAS, business, government, law enforcement, schools, youth, physicians, senior citizens, military, sports teams, religious institutions, service organizations, and individuals will demonstrate their commitment to drug free, healthy lifestyles by wearing and displaying red ribbons during this week long campaign; and
