Floors, walls, ceilings, not smooth, properly constructed, in disrepair, dirty surfaces

Inspector Findings

Floors in work area are very slippery. Discussion with manager indicated a grease cutter is used each night to degrease the floors. However, where tiles have been replaced there is a major difference in the traction compared to old worn tiles. This has been noted many times in inspections and poses a safety risk for employees. While the grease cutter was said to work it is only done at the end of each night. This does not help those employees that are working during the day and evening. The floor needs to be addressed. A grease resistant, easily cleanable floor material needs to be considered for this food service location.

Additional Information Collected During Inspection

Comments

Complaint indicated that employees were not wearing gloves with ready to eat foods or at appropriate times, tables in dining area were filthy as well as the floors in the dining area. Visit to the facility was made. The tables and floors in the dining area did have food debris on them. Employees were wearing gloves with ready to eat foods as well as other appropriate times.
