BOIL WATER ORDER

Loss of pressure in Town of Seneca Falls Water District, Fayette Water District #3, Fayette Water District #7 and Varick Water District #4.

BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

CUSTOMERS OF THE TOWN OF SENECA FALLS WATER DISTRICT, FAYETTE WATER DISTRICT #3, FAYETTE WATER DISTRICT #7 AND VARICK WATER DISTRICT #4 ARE HEREBY ORDERED BY THE SENECA COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT TO BOIL ALL WATER FOR DRINKING AND CULINARY PURPOSES.

On Tuesday 10/31/17 the water system lost pressure due to a break in the water main.

When the distribution pipes and mains lose pressure it increases the chance that untreated water and harmful microbes could enter the system.

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water certified for sale by the New York State Department of Health. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and food preparation **until further notice**. Boiling kills most bacteria and other organisms in the water.

Harmful microbes in drinking water can cause diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms. They may pose a special health risk for infants, some elderly, and people with severely compromised immune systems. The symptoms above are not just caused by organisms in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advise.

What is being done?

The main is currently under repair. The inter connection with the Village of Waterloo will be activated in order to maintain existing levels in the water storage tanks. You will be informed when tests confirm that no harmful bacteria are in the system and you no longer need to boil your water.
