



### Information about the Seneca County Seal

It was formally adopted by the Board of Supervisors on July 22, 1975.

The images on the seal represent the following:

Indian head—Indian Heritage

Vote-1848—the Seneca Falls Women’s Rights Convention of July 19-20

Scythe-1861—the Scythe Tree—James Wyman Johnson hangs his scythe in the tree near the house and tells his parents he is going to enlist in the Union army

Flag—1866—The first Memorial Day celebration in Waterloo

Tractor--Agriculture

Buildings in skyline—Industry

Beehive-1830—establishment of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints  
(Mormon Church) by Joseph Smith—the Mormons settle in Utah which has the  
nickname of the Beehive State  
5 stars-1968—establishment of Eisenhower College (Dwight Eisenhower was a five-star  
general)

The “stylized” letters S and C in the center represent Seneca County. Their form also  
represents waves, depicting two lakes which bound the county on the east and the west.
