**Welcome** - Meeting was called to order. Introductions made.

**Guest Speakers** – Jessica Chase – FLACRA Housing and Employment Manager, Joe Bowes – Ithaca Neighborhood Housing Services

There was a power point presentation for Pine View Circle Phase II in the town of Tyre– proposing a 59 units integrated Housing. There are 48 units currently in Tyre at Pine View Circle that was put up during Phase I. In phase II, five of the new apartments would be allocated to veterans and four will be allocated to persons with disabilities. 16 apartments will be 2 bedrooms apartments and 43 apartments will be 1 bedroom.

This would be partnered between Seneca County Community Counseling Center and FLACRA and would be able to share office space and group rooms.

**Committee Report (Stanley Hatch)** – OPWDD Subcommittee meeting was held prior to the CSB meeting via zoom on January 19, 2021 @ 5:30pm.

**Margaret Morse** – Review of the Admin remarks for December.

Telehealth is an exceptional way to help and get services to the clients. Productivity is up due to stress of Covid-19 and clients are loving the remote services. Staff is documenting their start and end times. Staff can zoom with parents and children. Telehealth is now permanent on the clinic license.

CCBHC – Certified Community Behavior Health Clinic – Upwards of \$2 million dollars over the next two years. Expectations would be increasing mental health peers, increase in health monitoring, increase

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in nursing, recovery support system for the Drop In Center, along with certified peers and contract workers to sustain these efforts.

**Tammy Orlopp** – The clinic has more frequent show rates, sessions may be shorter, but are more frequent. Caseloads have also gone up.

School staff – Schools are doing more family type work.
