## Community Services Board Meeting Minutes

December 15, 2020

**Welcome** - Meeting was called to order. Introductions made.

**Secretary minutes from November** - Motion to accept initiated by Theodore Papperman and seconded by Susan Ottenweller. No discussion. All in favor. None opposed. Motion carries.

**Committee Report (Theodore Papperman)** – ASA Subcommittee meeting was held prior to the CSB meeting via zoom on November 17, 2020 9:00am.

**Margaret Morse** – Review of the Admin remarks for November.

Clinic staff are taking their temperatures and using the CDC tracker every day prior to coming into the building. Per the tracker if they are not feeling well they will stay home. There are protocols in place and although there are staff at home not feeling well, quarantined due to possible exposure to someone else or have tested positive for Covid-19, those people have worked from home using the telehealth system we have in place as appropriate.

The clinic is working on a hybrid schedule where clinicians are working two days in clinic and three days home. When staff are working in the clinic they are seeing high risk clients or clients that would not otherwise be able to use zoom and need to be seen.

The clinic is running about 75% telehealth and 25% of the clients coming in for a face to face or use our telehealth equipment.

School staff are working in the schools, unless the schools they are working in have gone to remote sessions, then those staff work from their home office remotely.

Nurses are still seeing clients and doing the monthly injections. One of our nurses will go to the homes of our clients with a peer advocate worker to give injections.

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SOR – State Opioid Response – We have previously received a grant of \$212,000 and with a no cost extension we are able to roll over approximately \$80,000 to 2021 to help support our peers and nurse practitioner. We are engaging with SOR2 which requires networking regional approach. FLACRA is taking the lead with 6 area counties. Seneca County is eligible for approximately \$69,000.

**John Cleere** – Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) has completed. Officers are handling calls by phone, in person and online when necessary.

**Old Business** – School staff are seeing the struggling effects that teachers and students are facing with in class/remote/hybrid learning. Anxiety and stress levels are increasing as Covid-19 goes on with both students and staff.

**New Business** – A vote for Stanley Hatch and Veronica Mittak as members of the CSB for the 2021 year. All in favor. None opposed. Motion carries.

A vote for Pat Plyter to be the CSB chairperson for the 2021 year. All in favor. None opposed. Motion carries.

A vote for Stanley Hatch to be the 2021 OPWDD Subcommittee chairperson. All in favor. None opposed. Motion carries.

A vote for Theodore Papperman to be the 2021 ASA Subcommittee chairperson. All in favor. None opposed. Motion carries.
