## ***CYAC Program***

What is Connecting Young Adults to Careers (CYAC)?

It is a youth program designed for eligible youth between the ages of 14-24. This program provides expanded career development and services in the areas of employment and training for youth and young adults in our community.

### ***HOW do we help?***

The CYAC provides the following educational and employment services:

- Assessment to determine skills, interests and abilities
- Development of an individual plan to identify long-term and short-term career goals
- Opportunity to gain Work Experience
- Work Readiness Training including resume building, practice interviews, communication training and understanding Hard and Soft Skills.

The goal of the CYAC Program is to provide a comprehensive workforce preparation program that meets the participant's needs in reaching desired long-term and short-term goals – ultimately contributing to the betterment and growth of the community.

## ***WHO should Apply?***

CYAC is offered to youth and young adults between the ages of 14-24 who both WANT and NEED to make a positive change in their lives, and need help in finding the RIGHT opportunities to make it happen.

The program is designed to support young adults and guide them in making the right decisions and choices as it relates to their educational and occupational needs.

### ***Eligibility:***

- Reside in Seneca County
- Between the ages of 14-24
- At or Below 200% TANF Income Guidelines

### ***Youth are referred to the program by:***

- Community Agencies – Social Service
- Court Officials and Legal Professionals
- Family referrals
- Schools – counselors and superintendents
- Walk-in based upon information received
- Referral from other young adults in the program

## ***Summer TANF Program***

What is the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP)?

The SYEP provides youth between the ages of 14-20 with summer employment and educational opportunities. Participants work in a variety of entry-level jobs at government agencies, nonprofits and private sector businesses. The program runs approximately 6-8 weeks in July and August.

### ***The SYEP strives to:***

- Provide Work Readiness Training
- Increase awareness of services offered by local community-based programs
- Provide opportunities for career instruction, financial literacy training, paid work experience and social growth.

### ***Eligible SYEP Participants:***

- Eligible candidates for this program are economically disadvantaged according to federal guidelines
- Families currently receiving any of the following: Family Assistance, Safety Net, Medicaid, SNAP/Food Stamps, HEAP, or Supplemental Social Security (SSI).
