CAPITAL GRANT TO CONSTRUCT NEW T-HANGAR AT THE FINGER LAKES REGIONAL AIRPORT**

WHEREAS, New York State recently announced that \$50 million in State funding is available to support safety enhancements, modernize operations, promote environmental resilience, and enhance regional economic competitiveness of the State's public-use airports; and

WHEREAS, New York State Department of Transportation will administer the funding through the Aviation Capital Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, Finger Lakes Regional Airport (FLRA) is a Seneca County-owned facility servicing the general aviation needs of business and recreational users in Seneca County and the region; and

WHEREAS, the FLRA Airport Advisory Committee met on December 14, 2022 where members supported a grant application to construct a new T-Hangar to support and enhance airport operations; and

WHEREAS, new hangar construction is an eligible project under the grant program, with a maximum NYSDOT share of \$2.5M and a minimum local match of 10%; and

WHEREAS, if awarded, local match can be included in the 2024 Airport budget under Professional Fees 305610-54330; and

WHEREAS, the Planning, Development, Agriculture, and Tourism Standing Committee reviewed and approved this resolution on December 27, 2022; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Seneca County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes and directs the County Manager to sign all necessary documents to apply for and accept NYSDOT Aviation Capital Grant for up to \$2,500,000 to construct a new T-Hangar at the Finger Lakes Regional Airport; and be it further

Ontario, Seneca, Wayne and Yates Counties, through official action of their legislative bodies, and with approval of the Governor of the State of New York, established a Workforce Investment Area in 1999 consisting of the four Counties, and the Finger Lakes Workforce Investment Board in accordance with the Workforce Investment Act and agree to the same designated area under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, effective July 1, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act requires an Administrative Agreement between the Chief Elected Officials of the four Counties and the Finger Lakes Workforce Investment Board to designate the Grant Recipient and Fiscal Agent and to further define the respective responsibilities and roles of each party as identified for the operation of the programs under Title I of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) for the duration of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, this was approved by the Finger Lakes Workforce Investment Board at their September 21, 2022 meeting; and

WHEREAS, this resolution has been reviewed and approved by the Human Services Committee on December 27, 2022; now, therefore be it

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**SENECA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
PROCLAIMS JANUARY AS HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS MONTH IN SENECA COUNTY**

WHEREAS, Human Trafficking has been recognized as a form of modern day slavery that occurs nationally, in every state including New York and in many communities across the state; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking shall mean the recruitment, transport, harboring, or receipt of persons, by means of threat, or use of force, fraud or coercion; and

WHEREAS, anyone can be a victim of human trafficking. Most identified victims of trafficking in New York State are American born, females, however, immigrant and undocumented youth as well as male and transgender youth have been identified as victims of sex, and/or labor trafficking. (New York State Office of Children and Family Services); and

WHEREAS, youth who are especially vulnerable to being trafficked include: those with a history of abuse including sexual abuse, physical abuse, maltreatment, neglect and substance abuse, children with disabilities, children in foster care, or who have been involved in the justice system, LGBTQ youth and runaway and homeless youth; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Office of Children and Family Services has provided funding to the Seneca County Division of Human Services, over the last **7** years to provide community awareness campaigns, community education and training and to provide resources and services to youth identified as a victim of trafficking, or those who may be at risk; and

WHEREAS, the Human Services Committee approved this resolution on December 27, 2022; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, the Board of Supervisors proclaims January as Human Trafficking Awareness Month in Seneca County and recognizes January 11, 2023 as National Human Trafficking Awareness Day.

WHEREAS, finding competent and qualified persons to fill positions as deputies for the Sheriff's Department has become a serious concern to provide for the safety and protection of the Seneca County community; and

WHEREAS a waiver of the county residency requirement for Sheriff's Department deputies would substantially increase the recruitment opportunities to provide viable candidates for these positions within the Sheriff's Department, which are otherwise restricted to residents of Seneca County; and

WHEREAS a waiver of county residency does require an appropriate local law as set forth above; and

WHEREAS, this resolution has been reviewed and approved by the Personnel Standing Committee at its meeting on December 27, 2023; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Seneca County Board of Supervisors hereby introduces proposed Local Law B of 2023, entitled "A Local Law to waive residency for certain positions within the Seneca County Sheriff's Department", to read substantially in the following form:

SECTION 1. INTENT

It is the intent of this Local Law to waive the residency requirement for the position of Seneca County Deputy Sheriff to allow said individuals to reside in either Seneca County or a county contiguous to Seneca County.

**SENECA COUNTY
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SECTION 2. QUALIFICATIONS OF OFFICE

- A. In the County of Seneca, no provision of law, New York State or otherwise, requiring a person to be a resident of the political subdivision or municipal corporation of the State for which he/she shall be chosen or within which his/her official functions are required to be exercised, shall prevent a person from holding the Office of Deputy Sheriff for the County of Seneca, provided that such person resides in the State of New York and in Seneca County or a county contiguous to the County of Seneca, to wit: Cayuga, Tompkins, Schuyler, Yates, Ontario, or Wayne; and
- B. As allowed or provided under the Civil Service Law of the State of New York, preference in appointment may be given by the Seneca County Personnel Office and the appointing officer to those candidates who reside in Seneca County.
- C. A Deputy Sheriff who ceases to be a resident of New York State, Seneca County, or a county contiguous to Seneca County shall be deemed to have resigned his or her employment and vacated the position.

SECTION 3. PUBLIC OFFICERS LAW - SUPERSEDED AND/OR AMENDED.

This Local Law is intended to supersede and/or amend the provision of Public Officers Law Section 3(1), concerning residency requirements for local officers as the same concerns or effects the Office of Deputy Sheriff in Seneca County.

The provision of Section 3 of the Public Officers Law requiring a person to be a resident of the political subdivision for which he or she is chosen shall not prevent a person from holding the Office of Deputy Sheriff of the County of Seneca provided that such person resides in the County of Seneca or a contiguous county to the County of Seneca as set forth above, provided the county is within the State of New York.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY

If any section of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof that can be given effect without the invalid provision, but shall be confined in its operation to the section thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law shall take effect immediately and upon filing in the Office of the Secretary of State.
