Community Services Board Meeting Minutes

December 20, 2022

Welcome – 6:30pm Meeting was called to order. Quorum present.

Secretary minutes from November - Motion to accept initiated by John Cleere and seconded by Susan Ottenweller. No discussion. All in favor. None opposed. Motion carries.

Consumer Report – None

DIC - Jeanette Rock – Monthly report was submitted. He peers are cooking three times a week for the consumers. There was a monetary donation from It's a Wonderful Life race and Jeanette was able to purchase new pots and pans for the Drop In Center. A report will be submitted to MH subcommittee with all the statistics. Monthly calendar still in effect for activities. The recovery center upstairs is very successful with members attending regularly.

Committee Report (Dr. Joseph Lorenzetti) – ASA Subcommittee meeting was held prior to the CSB meeting via zoom on December 20, 2022 @ 5:00pm. Several agencies submitted reports for the last quarter.

Danielle Tilden – FLACRA – The CCBHC Expansion Grant has been approved. A methadone clinic will be opening in Geneva.

Finger Lakes Work Force Grant had requested to work out of the DIC to serve individuals. This will not happen due to no handicap accessibility into building or to the upstairs.

Fentanyl is being baked into counterfeit pain meds.

Karen Burcroff – Substance Abuse Coalition - Red Ribbon week has completed in the schools.

Tania Doverspike – LEC – MAT continues at the LEC for methadone and opiates.

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Mary Ker – VanDyke – Alcohol, opiates and stimulants are still a problem. There are still issues with the food service which comes from 5 points currently.

Jeremy Miller – Helio Health– There has not been any more being done in Seneca County, but Helio is growing in surrounding counties. Helio has detox and residential patients from Seneca County. Other changes – Helio has a new CEO and Helio will be increasing in size.

Program Director of Clinical Services - Brenda Black – Quarterly report – November there were 2377 services, 1518 services were in person in the clinic with the remainder via telehealth. 755 children services were provided.

Yearly stats – to date there have been 30,119 services, which breaks down to 18,686 in person, 11,433 telehealth. Of those 7,463 were services to children under the age of 18.

Incident review numbers for the year for the outpatient clinic – 22 incidents, 11 were deaths, 11 suicide attempts. No deaths were a result of suicide. There was an increase of suicide attempts over the past year. Last year at this time there were 5 attempts.

Mental Health Clinical Therapist for the South Seneca School and Ovid clinic

There has been no Suicide Coalition meeting since the Out Of Darkness Walk.

Program Director of Prevention – Treatment – Gambling - Tammy Orlopp — Report was submitted. Talk They Hear You campaign is up and running.
OD Map past 90 days there were 8 over doses. In November alone there were 5. None were fatalities. OD Map is an in real time Overdose Tracking System.

There has been lots of NARCAN trainings offered. Most offered to law enforcement. The goal is to have every family member of persons with addiction trained in the use of NARCAJ. Every person should have 4 doses of NARCAN on hand.

Del Lago has NARCAN kits and are seeing a higher number of overdoses.

Crisis Response – Margaret Morse for Bethany Felicita – There is an increase in number of services provided. Crisis team will expand coverage until late in the evenings. In January, there is hope to have coverage 24/7. Dialing 988 currently during the day is triaged and linked to the Crisis Response Team. After hours people are linked to CPEP.

Administrative Remarks- Margaret Morse DCS – The Admin reports were distributed.

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OMH new regulations for article 31 outpatient clinic – called Mental Health Outpatient and Rehabilitation Services which includes the addition of various services. This also expands outpatient treatment for in the community services.

Updates on staffing - Crisis Response Programs openings:

1 Clinician

LEC - John Cleere - the sheriff's office is waiting for guidance on the protection order for pistol and long guns – red flag law. A 941 order is where law enforcement can make a mental health arrest and look into the history of the person and decide if there is a need to secure all pistol and long guns. During a red flag order these items can be taken and secured at the sheriff's office until a judge decides at a court date whether the items can be released back to the person. Now there is a policy, but the county policy is different than state police. State police will take all pistols and long guns on all 941 call.

The two mental health workers Kaitlyn Laskoski and Tania Doverspike worked on a program with inmates who are parents to use the commissary funds to buy gifts for the children of those parents who were incarcerated during Christmas.

CIT training was in November. There was a good turnout
